(1) REPENTANCE AND _____

Acts 20:21 (ESV) 21 testifying both to Jews and to Greeks of repentance toward God and of faith in our Lord Jesus Christ.

Essential New Testament Doctrines

Hebrews 6:1-2 (ESV)

1 Therefore let us leave the elementary doctrine of Christ and go on to maturity, not laying again a foundation of repentance from dead works and of faith toward God, 2 and of instruction about washings, the laying on of hands, the resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgment.

There are three Greek words used in the New Testament to denote repentance.

- 1. The verb "metamelomai" is used as a change of mind, such as to produce regret or even remorse on account of sin, but not necessarily a change of heart. This word is used of the repentance of Judas (Matt. 27:3).
- 2. "Metanoeo" means to change one's mind and purpose, in the light of knowledge.
- 3. This verb, with the cognate noun "metanoia," is used of true repentance, a change of mind and purpose and life, to which remission of sin is promised.
- Encyclopedia of Bible Facts

1. Repentance

True Heartfelt Repentance Includes:

- 1. Initial guilt over one's sinful actions (Lev. 7:37; Ps. 38:4, Ps. 51:4,9 NIV)
- 2. Confession of sin (Pro. 28:13; 1 Jh. 1:9)
- 3. A seizure of God's mercy offered through Christ (Ps. 6:9; Micah 6:8).
- 4. A hatred of sin (Ps. 119:128; Job 42:5-6; 2 Cor. 7:10)

As Augustine said, "God offers forgiveness for repentance not repentance for sin."

"Repentance without faith leads to despair; faith without repentance leads to presumption."

2. Faith

Genuine Faith Includes:

- 1. Acknowledgment that the Savior of the World has come
- 2. Passionate joy over His cross that offers love and power for all who believe
- 3. Unshaken conviction in His saving grace

"Repentance without faith leads to despair; faith without repentance leads to presumption."

Repentance without faith is like a light bulb without electricity.
