Isaiah 66:13 (NIV)

As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you; and you will be comforted over Jerusalem."

FIRST - GOD COMFORTS THROUGH HIS _____.

1 Thessalonians 4:18 (NKJV) Therefore comfort one another with these words.

Romans 15:4 (NKJV) For whatever things were written before were written for our learning, that we through the patience and comfort of the Scriptures might have hope.

SECOND - GOD COMFORTS THROUGH _____.

2 Corinthians 1:4 (NKJV) who comforts us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort those who are in any trouble, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God.

2 Corinthians 7:13 (NKJV) Therefore we have been comforted in your comfort. And we rejoiced exceedingly more for the joy of Titus, because his spirit has been refreshed by you all.

1 Thessalonians 3:7 (NKJV) therefore, brethren, in all our affliction and distress we were comforted concerning you by your faith.

THIRD - GOD COMFORTS THROUGH HIS _____.

John 14:16 (KJV) And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever; (see also, John 15:26; 16:7)

Acts 9:31 (NKJV) Then the churches throughout all Judea, Galilee, and Samaria had peace and were edified. And walking in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, they were multiplied.

1 Thessalonians 4:18 (NKJV) Therefore comfort one another with these words.

Job 16:2 (NLT2) "I have heard all this before. What miserable comforters you are!"
